

Filming in Whitevale

1. Prior to any permits being issued please contact the Whitevale Film Liaison Representative and/or, an executive of the Whitevale & District Residents' Association to help coordinate the approval of any filming in our historic community.
2. After film permits/permissions have been granted, residents must be given a minimum of 48 hours advance notice prior to the start of filming. Residents must be notified of:
 - The name of the production
 - Type of production (i.e. feature film, TV pilot, documentary, TV movie)
 - Type, duration and description of activity (i.e. number of days, dates, times, including preps & wrap times)
 - The name and local contact number for production staff (i.e. location manager & assistants)
3. The production company must work around local school bus schedules as required.
4. Production vehicles arriving on location in the Hamlet of Whitevale will not be permitted on site before the time stipulated on the permit. Vehicles will not be permitted to idle for longer than 10 minute intervals, due to health and environmental concerns.
5. Production vehicles shall not block/park in front of driveways or beside private properties without the expressed written permission of the owner or tenant.
6. Where areas are designated for cast and crew, all trash and recycling must be disposed of responsibly in the proper receptacles. All trash must be removed from the location, ensuring the site is returned to its original condition, both inside and out.
7. Any special effects or pyrotechnics require a special permit from the City of Pickering and the Durham Regional Police Services. The Whitevale & District Residents' Association has full authority to refuse any special effects deemed unsafe for the community at large. Special permits are required for:
 - Night shoots after 11pm
 - Gunfire
 - Pyrotechnics/explosions/fires
8. No weekend/holiday filming is permitted without written letters of consent or signatures from the most affected residents.
9. Each production company should reinforce with their cast and crew that it is imperative to maintain a good rapport with the residents of Whitevale.

10. The Hamlet of Whitevale welcomes donations from production companies that film here. Your generosity allows for the maintenance and upkeep of our unique historic community. Donations can be made payable to the Whitevale & District Residents' Association.

11. The production company must supply proof of insurance for no less than \$5 Million.
