

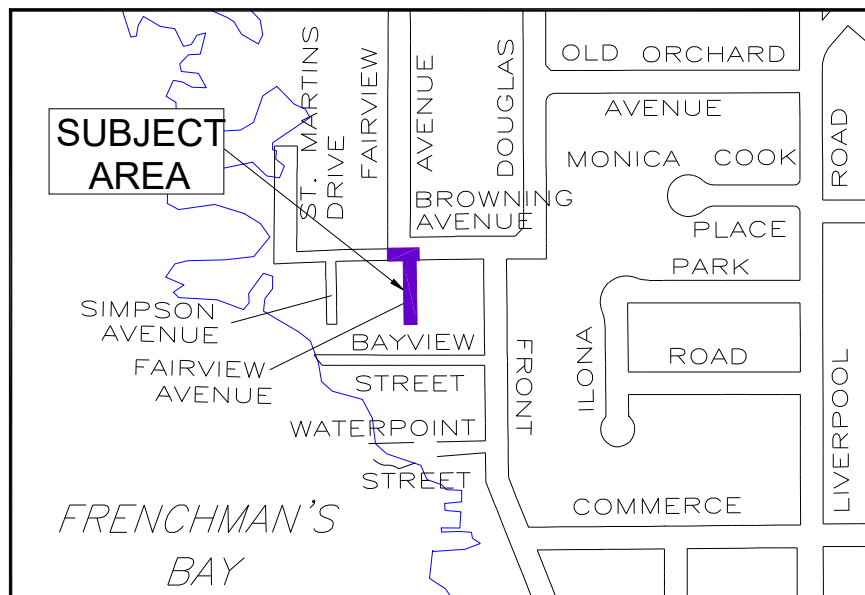

WHAT TO EXPECT

Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on Saturdays, only as required.



Telephone and Internet Services: This work generally does not affect phone, cable or internet service, however, for some individual properties, the utility wiring is not in a standard location, or not buried deep enough, and a disruption may occur. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should also contact their phone, cable or internet service provider.



Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects and sprinkler systems. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact Moe Zamaani, Sr. Coordinator, Capital Projects prior to the start of construction. **The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.**



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions affecting access to your driveway. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner (every effort is made to contact the resident first).



Parking Violation Notice: In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If you receive a parking violation notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:

- 1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on this Construction Notice and give them the parking violation number.
- 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking violation notice.

You may use this construction notice to explain why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices will not be cancelled if vehicles are parked illegally (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant, no parking zones etc.).



Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move items set out for collection to an appropriate location in order to be collected and will return blue boxes and green bins

Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.

Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only. Residents are encouraged to water newly installed sod to ensure its survival.

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
