## **A Connected City**

Pickering offers excellent access to an integrated transportation network, and a high-speed telecommunication system keeps you connected to the global economy.

#### **Integrated Transportation Infrastructure**

Pickering offers excellent access to a reliable transportation network of high capacity roads, railways, a seaport and proximity to three airports. Businesses can easily transport their products on a regional, national and global scale.

Pickering City Centre hosts a GO Train stop that connects to Union Station, and by extension, the TTC network - all connected with one fare. Future plans include the proposed Durham-Scarborough BRT (DSBRT) line, which will consist of 36 kilometres of bus rapid transit that would serve Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax, Pickering and Scarborough.

#### **Alto High Speed Rail**

The Govenment of Canada has announced the development of a high-speed rail line between the Toronto and Quebec City Corridor. The service will help reduce passenger and freight train delays, provide faster service, broaden connectivity across eastern Ontario, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and create jobs and opportunities. The City, in partnership with The Region of Durham, has proposed a stop in Pickering. As of 2024, the City's proposal of a conceptual design of a High-Speed Rail station and the surrounding development is in progress.

#### **Fibre Optic Broadband Network**

Pickering is committed to intelligent community development to create a connected city. Advancing broadband accessibility and information communications technologies across the city will play a critical role in generating economic growth. Pickering is one of the regions being serviced by the Rogers Accelerated High Speed Internet program, which is connecting more than 89,000 homes and businesses with Fibre in rural and underserved communities across Ontario. Durham OneNet, a Municipal Service Corporation, continues its work towards a 700 kilometre network that will connect the Region.


## Access To Major Markets

## **Boundless Opportunities**

Pickering is home to a variety of national and international companies. Key industry sectors include energy, advanced manufacturing, logistics, and information technology. Business costs are among the lowest in the Greater Toronto Area and are very competitive globally.





The Innovation Corridor is located in central Pickering on Highway 407 and includes over 800 acres of prestige employment land ready for development. The vision for the corridor is to support the creation of hightech jobs in a variety of industry sectors.



FGF Brands broke ground on the Wonderbrand Innovation Business Park in 2023. Phase one will entail four buildings, including manufacturing plants, a distribution centre, a learning centre, and more. Phase Two will open seven more, bringing in over 4,000 jobs to the area.



Kubota Canada Ltd., is a Japanese manufacturer of construction equipment. The company developed their new Canadian headquarters in Pickering, bringing over 200 jobs to the City.

# Highway 7 Pickering

Part of our \$27 billion plan to uild roads and highways

The Ontario government is investing \$12 million to support the widening of Highway 7 from Reesor Road in Markham to Brock Road in Pickering. The expansion from two to four lanes will help drivers spend less time in traffic and support the area's growing manufacturing, life sciences, and agricultural sectors.

Additionally, the Provincial government announced the permanent removal of tolls from the 407 East between Brock Road in Pickering and Highway 115 in Clarington, further supporting the development of industry in the corridor.



#### **Brock Industrial Business Park**

South of Highway 401, along Brock Road, is Pickering's industrial hub. With thousands of jobs located in and around the area, it provides the perfect opportunity for businesses to grow and have access to resources such as transportation and labour.

#### **Bay Ridges Industrial Centre**

Construction is underway for a new 270,152 square foot warehouse and associated offices. The development includes the construction of an extension to Clements Road to the site from Dillingham Road. A natural area portion of the site is being donated to the City for long term protection.

# **Energizing the Community**

Ontario Power Generation's (OPG) Pickering Nuclear Generating Station has provided Ontario with safe, clean, and reliable nuclear power for over 50 years. The refurbishment phase will create investment opportunities within the energy sector, highly skilled jobs, and economic growth.

### **Pickering Nuclear Generating Station Refurbishment**

The Ontario government is supporting Ontario Power Generation's plan to proceed with the next steps toward refurbishing Pickering Nuclear Generating Station "B" units. Once refurbished, Pickering would produce a total of 2,000 megawatts (MW) of electricity, equivalent to powering two million homes, helping to meet increasing demand for electrification and fueling the province's economic growth.

The Conference Board of Canada projects the full refurbishment project will create 11,000 jobs per year while contributing \$19.4 billion to Ontario's GDP over 11 years. This project would benefit communities across Ontario with approximately 90 per cent of spending happening inside the province.

Sustainability requires a collective effort of individuals, businesses, and governments working together to conserve resources and improve resiliency. #### **LEAF Program Supports Planting Efforts**

#### **Raising Awareness about Energy Incentives and Rebates**

Recognizing that time is limited for both businesses and residents, City staff have compiled a list of current energy incentives and rebates. Opportunities are posted on **pickering.ca/energysavings** and will be updated regularly.

#### New Schools Designed with Sustainability in Mind

Two new schools in Seaton were designed using both the Integrated Sustainable Design Standards and the Sustainable Seaton Place-Making Guidelines. The designs focus on energy conservation, occupant comfort, and sustainability. Scheduled to open in 2026, the schools will collectively incorporate a variety of elements such as high-performance heating and air conditioning systems, efficient lighting, a cool roof system, shading devices, operable windows, and occupancy sensors.

#### Sustainable Healthcare Infrastructure

The Seaton Village – Durham Region Long-Term Care Facility is currently under construction. Once completed, it will serve as a model of sustainable healthcare infrastructure in Durham. The facility will feature green roofs, unique outdoor spaces, native and drought-tolerant plantings, a backup generator, electric vehicle provisions, and a solar-ready roof system.





## **Growing Neighbourhoods**

Residents are attracted to Pickering for its attainable housing and cost of living. The City's continued progress in revitalizing and building residential communities and commercial areas keep our diverse population happy to live and work in Pickering.

## Seaton Community

Development is well underway for the Seaton Community, as one of Canada's largest combined residential, employment, and commercial developments. Seaton is designed to develop a complete community, offering a range of housing types, employment lands, and land densities. The first phase of Seaton saw residents move in and a commercial plaza built.

Over the next 20 years, the Seaton community is set to welcome 70,000 new residents and 35,000 new jobs.



### **Northeast Pickering**

The Northeast Pickering Secondary Plan is currently underway and is wrapping up Phase One of the Scoped Subwatershed Study. This environmental and hydrological assessment will help to inform the land uses for the Secondary Plan. Three Draft Land Use Plans have been published and once the Subwatershed Study is completed, a Preferred Land Use Plan will be completed and presented to stakeholders. Following feedback, the City will proceed with the Official Plan Amendment and Council Adoption.

The master-planned community in Northeast Pickering covers over 4,000 acres and will welcome over 40,000 residents and 10,000 jobs.



#### **Kingston Road Corridor Intensification Plan**

The City is aiming to improve the social, economic, and environmental health of Pickering through the amendment of its Official Plan for neighbourhoods located along Kingston Road and east of Brock Road. Our vision is to create a livable, walkable, transit-supportive community that is both a destination for shopping and a place of employment, with retail, commercial services, and offices within mixed-use buildings or on mixed-use sites.

#### **City Centre**

Pickering City Centre is one of the largest and most ambitious mixed-use development projects in Canada. Led by CentreCourt, this 55-acre masterplan community, located adjacent to The Shops at Pickering City Centre, is set to transform Downtown Pickering and will include 6,000 condo residences and a one-and-a-half-acre park. The goal is to create a walkable, sustainable, and connected destination that will become a bustling downtown node, welcoming visitors, commuters, and residents alike.

#### Jerry Coughlan Health & Wellness Centre

The Jerry Coughlan Health & Wellness Centre, Lakeridge Health's new state-of-the-art Surgical Centre and health-care facility is now open. The centre offers day surgery procedures, diagnostic and laboratory tests, an urgent care clinic, physicians' offices, and a pharmacy.

#### **Post-Acute Rehabilitation Centre**

The Province has also announced Durham Region's first stand-alone Post-Acute Rehabilitation Centre to be located in Pickering, as part of Lakeridge Health's master redevelopment plan.





# **Destination Pickering**

#### **Durham Live**

Durham Live is a 240-acre entertainment hub underway in Pickering. The vision is for the area to become the premier entertainment district east of Toronto. The Pickering Casino Resort opened in 2021, and the Hotel in 2023. The site also features The PIK, a space open to conventions and events, and The Arena has already hosted such acts as Bryan Adams, Jann Arden, and several United Boxing Promotions Fight Night events. Future plans include office buildings, cinemas, restaurants, and shops.

#### **Nautical Village**

Discover quaint shops and cafes and the aromas of fresh baking. Enjoy a stroll or bike along the Waterfront Trail or bring a chair and take in a sunset concert at Millennium Square. Pick up a paddle and launch your canoe, kayak or wind sail and enjoy the breeze on Lake Ontario.

#### Porsche Experience Centre

Only the third of its kind in North America and the first for Canada, the Porsche Experience Centre Toronto (PEC Toronto) is located on a 20-acre site at the Durham Live development. The PEC Toronto is slated to open by Spring 2025. The site will include a driving circuit over 2 kilometres in length, to highlight the prowess of the two and four-door sports cars in their ideal playground. Moreover, visitors will also be able to admire current and historic exhibition vehicles. stop by the café, and browse the Porsche shop.

#### The Shops at Pickering City Centre


# Pickering Heritage & Community Centre (PHCC)
