Background

The City of Pickering has retained Aquafor Beech Ltd. to update the 2009 Frenchman's Bay Watersheds Stormwater Management Master Plan. The updated Master Plan will help ensure the stormwater system continues to support community safety, environmental protection, and long-term climate resilience.

The purpose of the study is to evaluate the efficiency of the existing stormwater management system within Frenchman's Bay watersheds and develop a preferred stormwater management strategy to address current conditions as well as future growth and climate change. A map of the Frenchman's Bay Study area is included below.

The Study will be completed following the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment under the Environmental Assessment Act using the Master Plan Approach 2.

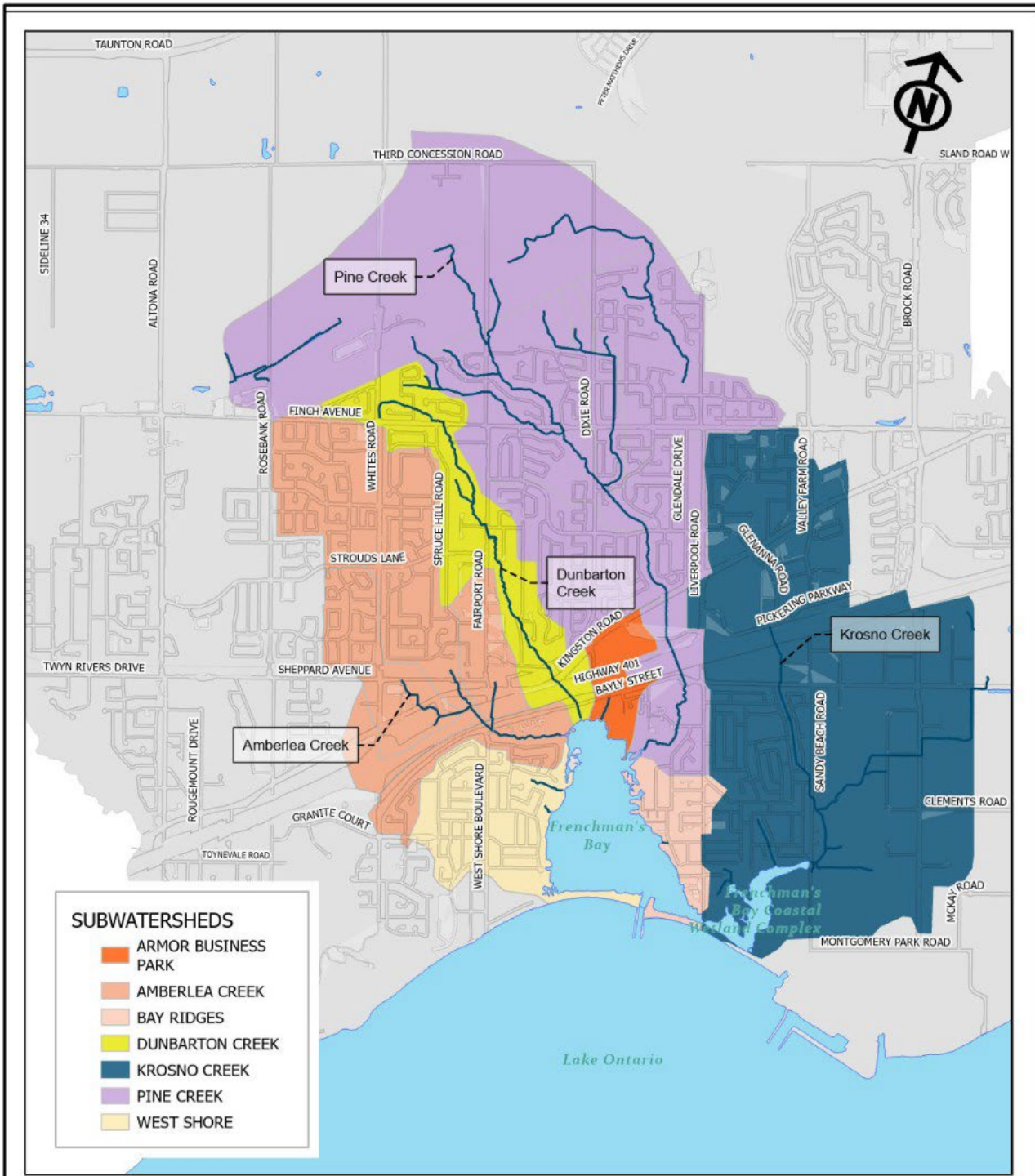
