The City of Pickering's contractor, Nuroad Construction Ltd., will be undertaking the reconstruction of Sixth Concession Road (Tender No. T2026-6) from the entrance to the Dorsay Community and Heritage Centre to approximately 60 metres west of the Greenwood Road intersection, as shown on the attached location map. The project includes:

- Reconstruction of Sixth Concession Road to a rural cross-section west of Greenwood Bridge and semi-urban cross-section east of Greenwood Bridge.
- Removal and replacement of the existing pavement, including new granular base.
- Installation of a new storm sewer system and storm outfalls.
- Channel restoration works within Duffins Creek.
- Structural, drainage, and safety improvements to Greenwood Bridge and associated infrastructure.

The work will be completed in two phases. Phase one includes Greenwood bridge rehabilitation and road reconstruction west of the bridge and is scheduled to be completed in 2026. Phase two includes installation of the new storm sewer system and road reconstruction east of the bridge, including the Greenwood Road intersection which is scheduled to be started and completed in spring / summer 2027.

To facilitate construction, a full road closure will be required. During Phase one construction, Greenwood Bridge will be closed and access to Highway 7 via Greenwood Road will not be available. During Phase two construction, the Greenwood Road/Sixth Concession Road intersection will be closed and access to Highway 7 via this route will not be available. Prior to construction, detour routes will be posted on the City's website, and advance notice signage will be installed on-site to maintain safe and efficient traffic flow throughout the construction period.

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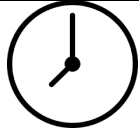

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on Saturdays, only as required.
	Telephone and Internet Services: If you experience a communication loss of services (telephone or internet) due to construction, it is the Homeowners responsibility to contact their respective service provider to arrange for a temporary/permanent repair. While the contractor makes every effort to avoid damages, unfortunately, it does occur as they occasionally encounter unexpected shallow wires not in compliance to city standards.
	Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions affecting access to your driveway. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner (every effort is made to contact the resident first).
	Parking Violation Notice: In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If you receive a parking violation notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date: 1) Contact persons listed on this Construction Notice and give them the parking violation number. 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking violation notice. You may use this construction notice to explain why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices will not be cancelled if vehicles are parked illegally (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant, no parking zones etc.).
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move items set out for collection to an appropriate location in order to be collected and will return blue boxes and green bins Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only. Residents are encouraged to water newly installed sod to ensure its survival.
	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects and sprinkler systems. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact City's representative listed on this Construction Notice prior to the start of construction.
