


## **Complete Streets**






## 2. What could make walking, cycling, or taking transit easier and/or safer in Pickering?











# Proposed Parks Hierarchy

#### **City-wide Park**

Provide a range of illuminated recreational facilities and host city-wide events.




Example – Esplanade Park



#### **Community Park**

Provides a range of illuminated recreational facilities at a smaller scale.




Example – Bay Ridges Kinsmen Park



### **Neighbourhood Park**

Accommodates play areas as well as one non-illuminated minirecreational field and possibly tennis or bocce courts, community mailboxes and passive areas.

information boards.




Example – Amaretto Park
